Music Makers Together @ Bridge House Care Home



Our special intergenerational sessions at Bridge House Care Home, run by Gillian and Helen, have now moved to Fridays. These FREE pre-school music sessions for children under 5 with their parents, carers or grandparents and residents of Bridge House Care Home, take place once per month, 11.40-12.25.

Recent themes include Colours, Things That Go, Gardens and Beside the Seaside. We enjoy sharing traditional songs and rhymes together and encourage children and adults to join in with actions, props and instruments. We aim to get the children interacting with the residents, whether through playing peek-a-boo or sharing out scarves and instruments.




Activities for School-age Children:

Particularly special were the two original compositions that were performed during the day:


- Silver and Gold by John Hawkes, member of Abingdon Community Orchestra

Song Titles Quiz







Oxfordshire Adult Learning



This year we have continued to run a variety of outreach courses to enable people who may not otherwise have the chance to make music. This Skills Agency Funding has been made available via Oxfordshire Adult Learning, through Abingdon and Witney College.

We have worked in partnership with a number of local organisations to deliver singing, general musicmaking plus exploring Ben's 'Black Spot' resource as a basis for creating music. We are extremely grateful to staff at these partner organisations for their support in running these sessions:

- Bridge House Care Home (2 courses)
- Stowford House Care Home (2 courses)
- Abingdon Court Care Home (2 courses)
- Old Station House Care Home (2 courses)

Additional funding from Oxfordshire Adult Learning and Oxfordshire Learning Network over the past couple of years has also allowed us to offer opportunities for free music-making music with families. In 2018-19 we have also run:

- 3 Parent and toddler ukulele courses at The Berin Centre
- Let's All Make Some Music (free day of family music workshops in the Easter holidays)
- Radley Primary Family Orchestra
- Rush Common Primary Family Orchestra



We are delighted to have heard that we have been successful in our application for further funding of outreach work in 2018-19 and we look forward to extending our family learning opportunities.

Hosted groups and classes:

We also host the following musical opportunities, run by our teacher / musician members:

• Jazz Ensemble Playing Course (Wednesday evenings)

The emphasis of the course is on playing in a band and will cover playing well-known standards as well as some theory and ear-training along the way. For: those with little or no experience of playing jazz in a group; any instrumentalists or singers with reasonable technical ability; over 16s.

• Abingdon Strings (Alternate Saturdays 10.30-12.30 / 1-2pm)

This is a fortnightly class, led by Marion Crombie and Valerie Findlay, for adult string players who want to play in a group primarily for pleasure rather than for exams. There is also a beginners group who meet at 1pm.

• Instrumental Lessons

Through our teacher members, lessons are offered in keyboard, woodwind, strings, brass, guitar, percussion and theory. Please contact the Abingdon Music Centre office, or see pages 13-14, for further details.

• Rehearsal Space

If you want to play with a small group of musicians 'for fun, not for exams,' or simply need a practice space, that's possible too.
